AGES 2-4

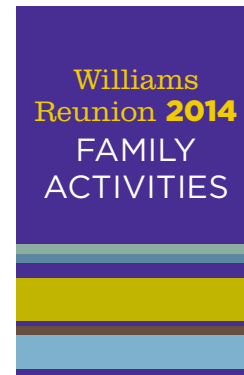
- Wheels! Explore a fire engine, police cruiser, ambulance, front loader, and street sweeper.
